

When the <u>stone</u> had been sealed by the <u>Jews</u>, while the soldiers were guarding Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, You rose on the third day, O Savior, granting <u>life</u> to the world. The <u>pow</u>ers of heaven therefore cried to You, O <u>Giv</u>er of Life: "Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Christ! <u>Glory to Your <u>King</u>dom!// Glory to Your dispensation, O <u>Lov</u>er of mankind!"</u>

#### **Troparion Tone 7** (for the Feast of Transfiguration)

You were trans<u>fig</u>ured on the mount, O <u>Christ</u> God, revealing Your glory to Your disciples as far as they could <u>bear</u> it. Let Your <u>ev</u>erlasting Light shine upon us <u>sin</u>ners through the prayers of the Theo<u>to</u>kos!// O Giver of <u>Light</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

#### **Troparion Tone 7** (for St Herman)

Joyful <u>North</u> Star of the <u>Church</u> of Christ, guiding all people to the Heavenly <u>King</u>dom; teacher and a<u>pos</u>tle of the <u>True</u> Faith; intercessor and de<u>fend</u>er of the oppressed; a<u>dorn</u>ment of the Orthodox Church in A<u>mer</u>ica: blessed Father Herman of A<u>las</u>ka,// pray to our <u>Lord</u> Jesus <u>Christ</u> for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

#### Kontakion Tone 1 (Resurrection)

As <u>God</u>, You rose from the tomb in <u>glo</u>ry, raising the <u>world</u> with Yourself. Human <u>na</u>ture praises You as God, for death has <u>van</u>ished. Adam exults, O <u>Mas</u>ter! Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage and <u>cries</u> to You:// "You are the Giver of Resurrection to <u>all</u>, O Christ!"

#### Kontakion Tone 3 (for St Herman)

The e<u>ter</u>nal light of <u>Christ</u> our <u>Sav</u>ior guided you, blessed Father <u>Her</u>man, on your evang<u>el</u>ical journey <u>to</u> America to proclaim the <u>Gos</u>pel of peace. Now you stand before the throne of <u>glo</u>ry; inter<u>cede</u> for your land <u>and</u> its <u>people</u>:// peace for the <u>world</u> and salvation for our souls!

#### Kontakion Tone 7 (for the Feast of Transfiguration)

On the <u>moun</u>tain You were transfigured, O <u>Christ</u> God, and Your disciples beheld Your glory as far as they could <u>see</u> it; so that when <u>they</u> would behold Your <u>cru</u>cified, they would understand that Your suffering was <u>vol</u>untary, and would pro<u>claim</u> to the <u>world</u>// that You are truly the <u>Ra</u>diance of the <u>Fa</u>ther.

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us as we have set our hope on You! (Ps 32/33:22) *v: Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just! (Ps 32/33:1)* **Tone 7:** Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints. (Ps 115/116:15)

#### **ON THE DORMITION OF THE THEOTOKOS**

This feast, which is also sometimes called the **Assumption**, commemorates the death, resurrection and glorification of Christ's mother. It proclaims that Mary has been "assumed" by God into the heavenly kingdom of Christ in the fullness of her spiritual and bodily existence. The Tradition of the Church is that Mary died as all people die, not "voluntarily" as her Son, but by the necessity of her mortal human nature which is indivisibly bound up with the corruption of this world.

The Orthodox Church teaches that Mary is without personal sins. In the Gospel of the feast, however, in the liturgical services and in the Dormition icon, the Church proclaims as well that Mary truly needed to be saved by Christ as all human persons are saved from the trials, sufferings and death of this world; and that having truly died, she was raised up by her Son as the **Mother of Life** and participates already in the eternal life of paradise which is prepared and promised to all who "**hear the word of God and keep it.**" (*Luke 11:27-28*)

The services of the feast repeat the main theme, that the Mother of Life has "passed over into the heavenly joy, into the divine gladness and unending delight" of the Kingdom of her Son. (Vesper verse) The Old Testament readings, as well as the gospel readings for the Vigil and the Divine Liturgy, are exactly the same as those for the feast of the Virgin's nativity and her entrance into the Temple. Thus, at the Vigil we again hear Mary say: "**My soul magnifies the Lord and my Spirit rejoices in God my Saviour.**" (*Luke 1:47*) At the Divine Liturgy we hear the letter to the Philippians where St. Paul speaks of the self-emptying of Christ who condescends to human servitude and ignoble death in order to be "highly exalted" by God his Father. (*Philippians 2:5-11*) And once again we hear in the Gospel that Mary's blessedness belongs to all who "**hear the word of God and keep it.**" (*Luke 11:27-28*)

Thus, the feast of the **Dormition of the Theotokos** is the celebration of the fact that all men are "highly exalted" in the blessedness of the victorious Christ, and that this high exaltation has already been accomplished in Mary the Theotokos. The feast of the Dormition is the sign, the guarantee, and the celebration that Mary's fate is, the destiny of all those of "low estate" whose souls magnify the Lord, whose spirits rejoice in God the Saviour, whose lives are totally dedicated to hearing and keeping the Word of God which is given to men in Mary's child, the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. Finally it must be stressed that, in all of the feasts of the Virgin Mother of God in the Church, the Orthodox Christians celebrate facts of their own lives in Christ and the Holy Spirit. What happens to Mary happens to all who imitate her holy life of humility, obedience, and love. With her all people will be "blessed" to be "more honorable than the cherubim and beyond compare more glorious than the seraphim" if they follow her example. All will have Christ born in them by the Holy Spirit. All will become temples of the living God. All will share in the eternal life of His Kingdom who live the life that Mary lived.

In this sense everything that is praised and glorified in Mary is a sign of what is offered to all persons in the life of the Church. It is for this reason that Mary, with the divine child Jesus within her, is call in the Orthodox Tradition the **Image of the Church**. For the assembly of the saved is those in whom Christ dwells.

### **A PRAYER TO SAINT HERMAN OF ALASKA**

O Almighty God, We praise and glorify You, Our Lord and Creator. All the earth and everything within it acknowledges You as Creator, The Eternal Father.

Heaven and Earth, Angels and Men, together, praise and glorify You, the most glorious company of Apostles, the praiseworthy fellowship of Prophets, the great and noble gathering of Martyrs, the whole community of Saints, all praise You.

We the members of the holy community on earth pray: Make us worthy with all the Saints in Heaven, especially the newly glorified Elder, the Blessed Herman of Alaska, to reign in Your everlasting glory.

On this day the Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church praises and glorifies You, our God, in joyful thanksgiving. The inheritors and children of the Holy Church of Christ which you, 0 Blessed Father Herman and your holy companions planted here, now flowering and growing throughout this great continent, gather at your reliquary. We gaze at your Relies in the knowledge that your soul joins together with the Apostles, Prophets, Martyrs, Saints and the Heavenly Hosts before the Throne of the Most Merciful God in praise of the Holy Trinity.

O Blessed Hermit of Spruce Island, good teacher of the faith in the Holy Trinity, and our Spiritual Father, intercede before the throne of the Almighty God, for peace within the Church, the dispelling of all disunity, faithlessness and discord.

Come to the aid of our spiritual leaders that they may always be true and effective instruments of the Holy Spirit, with the power to proclaim the evangelical truths, with the wisdom to enlighten the unenlightened, with the spirit to inspire all to love the knowledge of God, with the perseverance to defend the Church, even unto death, from all enemies both within and without and at all times.

May the hearts of your spiritual children be filled with that faith and love of the Holy Church which you manifested in your holy life; praying to Him to: deliver us from the temptations which cause us to fall; renew our child-like faith in our Heavenly Father; replace our trust in God, and in Him alone; satisfy our thirst for the true knowledge of God; teach us to serve God faithfully; transfigure our life that it may truly reflect the image and likeness of God.

O Holy Father and Patron of the Church in America: Be a physician to the weak in faith; be a support to the fallen; be a defender to the defenseless; be a bulwark of strength to the weary in spirit; be a guide to the travelers by sea, by land and by air; be our heavenly intercessor.

O Blessed Father Herman of Alaska, together with all the Saints and the Heavenly Hosts, pray to God that on each of us He will bestow wisdom for our mind, strength for our will, light for our spirit, enabling us to attain to the true peace of life which is from God alone. We praise with joyous and grateful hearts, the Life-Creating Trinity: Father Almighty, Only-Begotten Son, Comforter, Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.
