FESTAL SEASON: Today is the Leavetaking of the Nativity: the last day on which we sing the Nativity hymns for this year. The fast-free period continues, however, until the Eve of Theophany this Friday (so Friday is a fast day, but Wednesday is not.) On Friday, we'll have the Royal Hours in the morning, and the Vigil with Great Blessing of Waters in the evening. On the feast, we'll have Divine Liturgy at 9 Am. As has been the practice in past years, we'll plan our blessing of the lake for the following Saturday.
